<p>Would you support legislation to change the age of a person who can purchase a firearm in Delaware from 18 to 21, similar to HB 330 (during the 149th General Assembly)?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, being that guns are dangerous tools of destruction in the wrong hands, I would prefer to see their usage restricted to a higher standard of "adulthood" similar to alcohol.</p>
<p>Would you support "unsafe storage of a firearm" legislation, which would revise the crime of 'unlawfully permitting a child access to a firearm' from a class A misdemeanor to a class B misdemeanor, similar to what was laid out in HB 366 (during the 149th General Assembly)?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, firearm possession and usage should be restricted to the legal and registered owner of that firearm. Allowing an untrained child, who may have only experienced firearms through their portrayal in film and video games, to have access to firearms, could lead to catastrophic results for themselves or others.</p>
<p>Would you support efforts to prohibit the manufacture, sale, purchase, transfer, or delivery of large-capacity magazines, as they were defined in HB 375 (during the 149th General Assembly)?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, high capacity magazines have no place in the sporting usage of firearms for pursuits such as hunting or trap shooting, and serve only to enable greater carnage in an active shooter situation. Military style large capacity magazines should be reserved for our armed forces and police only.</p>
<p>Would you support efforts to prohibit the manufacture, sale, offer to sell, transfer, purchase, receipt, possession, or transport of assault weapons in Delaware, as they were defined in SB 163 (during the 149th General Assembly)?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, assault weapons have no place in sporting use and only serve to enable greater destruction and carnage. Even our most conservative Supreme Court Justice ever, Antonin Scalia, recognized the constitutionality of keeping military hardware like assault weapons out of the hands of the general populace.</p>
<p>Would you support efforts to prohibit the manufacture, sale, offer to sell, transfer, purchase, receipt, possession, or transport of silencers (suppressors) in Delaware?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, while some may argue that silencers can protect hunters from ear damage, these are generally bad faith arguments to obscure their intended use, obscuring the position of a shooter. These devices can make it harder for law enforcement to track and stop an active shooter, and for that reason should be banned.</p>
<p>Would you oppose Concealed Carry Reciprocity legislation, which would allow anyone who can carry a concealed gun in one state to carry it another?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, many states do not have as rigorous of a licensing process as we do here in Delaware, and this loophole would effectively prevent our state from limiting those who would be normally be barred from obtaining a permit.</p>
<p>Would you support legislation to ban the production, sale, transfer, distribution, possession, and use of 3D printed firearms?</p>	
Yes	<p>Yes, anything that would prevent a firearm from being traced to its original and lawful owner should be opposed.</p>
